

REFLECTION

In the Synoptic tradition, the first to be called by Jesus were fisherman. The Gospel of John follows another tradition. Andrew and an unnamed companion were former disciples of John the Baptist who follow Jesus after John pointed him out as the Lamb of God. Then Andrew brings his brother Simon to Jesus (John 1:35-42).

The call follows a paradigm: it is Jesus who chooses; it is also he who invites. But Jesus ' invitation is made in total respect; he never forces. Freedom is essential to vocation, a freedom that appears as personal adherence and a loving gift. This call may even meet with refusal, as in the case of the rich man (Mark 10:17-22). But when a positive response is given, something radical happens to the one called. Jesus changes the name of Simon to Cephasmeaning Rock. It is a sign of his mission and place in the community of Jesus 'disciples.

In this Gospel, it is important to note the role of Andrew in bringing his brother Jesus. In the pastoral work of vocation promotion, Andrew can be a model for the Church. Andrew 'discovers' Jesus and his account of this discovery opens the way for the meeting of his brother and Jesus.

Vocation is an unfathomable mystery involving the relationship between a person and Jesus. However, the Church, the community of believers, is truly present and at work in the calling of a priest or a religious. The members are like Andrew who, after knowing Christ, pave the way for other people to encounter him.

Dear parishioners,

We have again new stricter restrictions due to some cases of community transmission of Coronavirus in many places of NSW. These new restristions took effect from Sunday, 3rd Janurary.

We have to be careful and take all reasonable precautions to protect the health of everyone involved and to observe the directives we have received. We are again back to 4 square metre rule with 100 people in the church. Indicators are in each pew for the limit of number of people to sit unless from same household. Dot markers are placed where people should sit. No booking required on all masses but on a first come, first serve basis.

It is always a requirement that attendees should register before entering the church. It is compulsory that registration now is through scanning the Service NSW QR code using smartphones with Service NSW App. For those with no smart mobile phones please write your name, telephone or email address in the sheet provided upon church entry at main door on weekends, side doors on Weekdays.

As you would all be aware, the government has made the <u>wearing of face masks</u> mandatory in closed-in places, including places of worship. THIS IS NOW COMPULSORY, \$200 fine imposed for not wearing. Congregation singing is now cancelled until further notice. We are trying as much as possible to keep our church a safe place in which all are welcome to come and worship the Lord. I will be wearing mask during and after mass as required by the Archdiocese. I know you will understand that I do so for our common protection and compliance.

- Our Lady of Fatima Kingsgrove church is open for personal prayer from 8:30am to 12:00 noon Tuesday to Saturday. Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required. Entry by side door.
- 2. Daily Mass: Tuesday- Thursday and Saturday 9:15am Friday 11:00am-12:00pm Exposition of the Holy Eucharist followed by Mass at 12:00pm. Maximum of 100 people. Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required.
- 3. Saturday 9:15 am morning Mass is followed by Confession until 10.30am. No booking required.

4. Weekend Mass, regular schedule resumed, maximum of 100 people. All weekend mass - no Booking required Saturday Vigil - 5:00pm Sunday - 8:30am 10:00am

Please come early when attending mass for registration and to secure your seats. Untill further notice, we are allowed 100 people inside the church on a first come, first, serve basis. Clune Centre will be open with speakers for attendees over 100.

 In our 20 December bulletin, we had stated that Dispensation had been lifted but with the current situation of more cases of Coronavirus going around, dispensation is again back until further notice. All Catholics but priests will be dispensed from Sunday and Holy day obligations. Those unable to attend mass are encouraged to do Prayers at home, reading scriptures or watching live streamed mass on TV and asking God for graces normally received at Holy Communion.

- 6. **Anointing of the sick** will continue to be administered as a Viaticum for the gravely ill and the dying.
- 7. For **funerals** up to 100 people with 4-square metre rule.
- 8. **Baptisms** can be celebrated with 100 attendees subject to 4-square-metre rule.
- 9. Weddings can be celebrated with 100 guests inside our church. Other venues, 100 people.

All of these notices might change depending on the Covid 19 situation.

If you or someone you love is ill and you wish to offer a prayer for them, I am available to pray for you over the telephone. Please call to organise. Please remember that you may offer Mass for

anniversaries, special intentions, thanksgiving or any reason simply by placing your request in an envelope and bringing that to the office or in the mass offering box at the presbytery.

First Reading

1 Sm 3:3-10.19

A reading from the first book of Samuel

Speak, O Lord, your servant is listening. Samuel was lying in the sanctuary of the Lord where the ark of God was, when the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He answered, 'Here I am'. Then he ran to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli said, 'I did not call. Go back and lie down.' So he went and lay down. Once again the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' He replied, 'I did not call you, my son; go back and lie down.' Samuel had as yet no knowledge of the Lord and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. Once again the Lord called, the third time. He got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli then understood that it was the Lord who was calling the boy, and he said to Samuel, 'Go and lie down, and if someone calls say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

The Lord then came and stood by, calling as he had done before, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel answered, 'Speak, Lord, your servant is listening.'

Samuel grew up and the Lord was with him and let no word of his fall to the ground.

Your bodies are members of the body of Christ. The body is not meant for fornication; it is for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. God, who raised the Lord from the dead, will by his power raise us up too. You know, surely, that your bodies are members making up the body of Christ; anyone who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with him.

Keep away from fornication. All the other sins are committed outside the body; but to fornicate is to sin against your own body. Your body, you know, is the temple of the Holy Spirit, which is in you since you have received him from God. You are not your own property; you have been bought and paid for. That is why you should use your body for the glory of God.

Gospel Jn 1:35-42

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John They saw where Jesus lived and they stayed with him. As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, 'What do you want?' They answered, 'Rabbi,' - which means Teacher - 'where do you live?' 'Come and see' he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour. One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' – which means the Christ – and he took Simon to Jesus, Jesus looked hard at him and said. 'You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas' meaning Rock.
