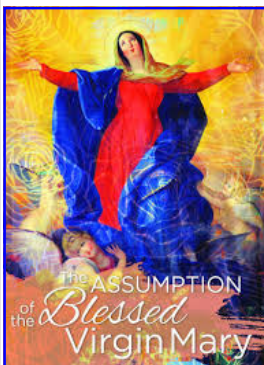

REFLECTION

Peter steps out of his boat into the troubled waters of life. Feeling the sudden force of the wind, he is afraid, experienced fisherman though he is. We can identify with Peter as we recall times of discouragement, disappointment, or frustration, when we knew the need to move forward and yet were hopelessly stuck. In the first reading, Elijah is overcome with fear and goes into hiding. He hears the voice of God telling him to go to Mt Horeb. There he will meet God. On the mountain he finds that God is not in the earthquake, or the fire, or the storm, but in a gentle breeze. When a breeze arrives he covers his face for he knows God is present! Peter, in the storm's violence, hears Jesus' gentle reproach about his doubt and lack of faith. This same gentleness is in God's word that echoes in our hearts in difficult moments. Instead of listening to our panic, our fear and our doubts, let us tune in to the gentle, personal, encouraging word that God is speaking in our hearts: 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid!'

Dear parishioners,

COVID-19 remains present and highly infectious in the community. With the relaxation of isolation measures and during this winter time, an increase in cases are all around. We are therefore encouraged to take necessary precautions and to download the CovidSafe App and abide by the latest public health advice.

Further restrictions from 24 July was announced by the Archdiocese with churches in NSW to open under the four-square-metre rule with strict conditions: we must take all reasonable precautions to protect the health of everyone involved and to observe the directives we have received. Though our church can have more with the four-square-metre rule including upstairs, we are again restricted to have only 100 people. Dot markers are placed where people should sit.

It is a requirement of the Archdiocese that attendees should write their name, telephone or email address in the sheet provided upon church entry at main door on weekends, side doors on weekdays.

As you would all be aware the government has strongly recommended the wearing of masks in closed-in places, including places of worship. Whilst this is not compulsory, we would urge you to consider complying for your benefit and that of everyone else too. We are trying as much as possible to keep our church a safe place in which all are welcome to come and worship the Lord. I, for one choose to wear a mask, particularly when distributing communion and when meeting and talking to people. I know you will understand that I do so for our common protection.

1. Our Lady of Fatima Kingsgrove church is open for **personal prayer from 8:30am to 12.00 noon Tuesday to Saturday**. Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required. Entry by side door.

2. **Daily Mass:**

Tuesday- Thursday and Saturday 9.15am

Friday 11.00am-12.00pm Exposition of the Holy Eucharist followed by Mass at 12.00pm.

Maximum of 100 people. Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required.

3. **Saturday** morning Mass is followed by **confession** until **10.30am**. No booking required.

4. **Weekend Mass**, regular schedule resumed, **maximum of 100 people.**

Saturday Vigil - 5:00pm, no booking required.

Sunday - 8:30am; no booking required.

10:00am booking required (please call the parish Office; booking close by 5:00 pm Friday)

Sunday-5:00pm; no booking required

No more live streamed mass from 5 July.

Please come early when attending weekend mass for registration and to secure your seats. We are allowed only 100 people inside the church on a first come, first serve basis except for 10:00am mass that requires booking.

5. All Catholics continue to be dispensed from Sunday obligations.

6. At-risk parishioners (elderly, the sick and those with

compromised immune and respiratory systems) should still not attend.

7. **Anointing of the sick** will continue to be administered as a Viaticum for the gravely ill and the dying.

8. For **funerals** up to 100 people are permitted.

9. **Baptisms** can be celebrated with also maximum of 100 attendees.

10. **Weddings** are also permitted up to 100 people.

If you or someone you love is ill and you wish to offer a prayer for them, Father George and myself are available to pray for you over the telephone. Please call to organise.

Please remember that you may offer Mass for anniversaries, special intentions, thanks giving or any reason simply by placing your request in an envelope and bringing that to the office or in the mass offering box at the presbytery.

On a disappointing note, sometime between last Saturday night and Sunday morning, the statue of St Francis of Assisi, located in the Garden of Peace, was vandalised; it was knocked to the ground, beheaded and the head itself is now missing. It is sad and disturbing that this should happen, it is a desecration and an offence to our religious beliefs and sensitivity. The police have attended and are investigating, unfortunately the CCTV cameras did not capture any useful information. Like St Francis of Assisi, a man of peace and prayer, we too pray for peace everywhere in the world and for everyone, including those responsible for this reprehensible action. We pray also for all who have lost their faith and those yet to find it.
