

REFLECTION

Today 's first reading Gospel contain wise and important teachings on the need to forgive others. Resentment and anger not dealt with are foul things. We know this but at times we still find it hard, even impossible, to forgive.

Perhaps the best way to begin to address forgiveness is to follow the lead of today 's responsorial psalm and focus on the forgiveness and compassion of God. In this much loved hymn, the psalmist marvels that God 's mercy is in no way proportionate to the offence: 'God does not treat us according to our faults'. Nor is God 's forgiveness partial. No, 'God forgives all our guilt and heals all our wounds.'

Perhaps one reason why God is all forgiving is because God is all knowing. God, who created us, knows our human frailty. In a beautiful verse from this psalm, not included in today 's liturgy, we read: 'God knows how we are formed, remembers that we are dust'. We, for our part, can forget human frailty and demand from one another and from ourselves a perfection of which only God is capable.

If we remember the abiding mercy of God towards us, and if we can be forgiving of our own failings, we will be more able to forgive wholeheartedly the brother or sister, husband or wife, parent or child, friend or enemy who wrongs us.

Dear parishioners,

COVID-19 remains present and highly infectious in the community. With the relaxation of isolation measures and during this winter time, an increase in cases are all around. We are therefore encouraged to take necessary precautions and to download the CovidSafe App and abide by the latest public health advice.

Further restrictions from 24 July was announced by the Archdiocese with churches in NSW to open under the four-square-metre rule with strict conditions: we must take all reasonable precautions to protect the health of everyone involved and to observe the directives we have received. Though our church can have more with the four-square-metre rule including upstairs, we are again restricted to have only 100 people. Dot markers are placed where people should sit.

It is a requirement of the Archdiocese that attendees should write their name, telephone or email address in the sheet provided upon church entry at main door on weekends, side doors on weekdays.

As you would all be aware the government has strongly recommended the wearing of face masks in closed-in places, including places of worship. Whilst this is not compulsory, we would urge you to consider complying for your benefit and that of everyone else too. We are trying as much as possible to keep our church a safe place in which all are welcome to come and worship the Lord. I, for one choose to wear a mask, particularly when distributing communion and when meeting and talking to people. I know you will understand that I do so for our common protection.

- 1. Our Lady of Fatima Kingsgrove church is open for personal prayer from 8:30am to 12.00 noon Tuesday to Saturday. Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required. Entry by side door.
- 2. Daily Mass:

Tuesday- Thursday and Saturday 9.15am Friday 11.00am-12.00pm Exposition of the Holy Eucharist followed by Mass at 12.00pm.

Maximum of 100 people. Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required.

- 3. Saturday morning Mass is followed by confession until 10.30am. No booking required.
- 4. Weekend Mass, regular schedule resumed, maximum of 100 people. Saturday Vigil - 5:00pm, no booking required. Sunday - 8:30am: no booking required. 10:00am booking required (please call the parish Office; booking close by 5:00 pm Friday. Sunday-5:00pm; no booking required No more live streamed mass from 5 July. allowed only 100 people inside the church on a
 - Please come early when attending weekend mass for registration and to secure your seats. We are first come, first serve basis except for 10:00am mass that requires booking.
- 5. All Catholics continue to be dispensed from Sunday obligations.
- 6. At-risk parishioners (elderly, the sick and those with

compromised immune and respiratory systems) should still not attend.

- 7. Anointing of the sick will continue to be administered as a Viaticum for the gravely ill and the
- 8. For **funerals** up to 100 people are permitted.
- 9. Baptisms can be celebrated with also maximum of 100 attendees.
- 10. **Weddings** are also permitted up to 100 people.

If you or someone you love is ill and you wish to offer a prayer for them, I am available to pray for you over the telephone. Please call to organise.

Please remember that you may offer Mass for anniversaries, special intentions, thanks giving or any reason simply by placing your request in an envelope and bringing that to the office or in the mass offering box at the presbytery.


9.15am Mass will be cancelled for that day.


