## REFLECTION

The Trinity is not a mathematical conundrum by God's self-revelation as Love.

St Paul concludes his Second Letter to the Corinthians with the lovely words frequently used as a greeting to us at the beginning of Mass: 'The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all' (13:3). This Trinitarian formula celebrates the glowing heart of our lives as creatures, as disciples and Church. When we consider the mystery of our existence, we might ask: 'What is man that you should keep him in mind, mortal man that you care for him?' God has answered us in human experience. The Father so loved the world he had created in Christ that he sent his only Son that we might have eternal life in the Holy Spirit. God, Father, Son and Spirit, has crowned us with glory and honour. It is only right that we respond. Glory to the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit: to God who is, who was and who is to come.

### To be a walking contradiction- From Sue the Youth Coordinator

One of the challenges of ministering to young people and strengthening their faith is guiding them to recognise that they are called to be more than who they see. Today's youth are a visual generation totally absorbed by images and ideals which stress external beauty and physical strength. One of the greatest ways to teach them what true beauty entails is to show them the worth of being a walking contradiction. Being rebellious is a character attributed to young people because of their need for self-discovery and exploration which goes hand in hand with adventure and the thrill seeking that so many of them crave. Virtue, goodness, integrity, compassion, truthfulness, sincerity are notions and ideals which are no longer valued or regarded as important by a world fixated on the superficial and superfluous. It's up to us to show the youth how to rage and rebel against the world's dictates. To be a walking contradiction means: To break conventions but keep the commandments: It's our time.

## Sunday, 16 Jun 2019: The Most Holy Trinity - Year C

### First Reading Prv 8:22-31

#### A reading from the book of Proverbs

*Wisdom was born before the earth was made.*

The Wisdom of God cries aloud:

The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries – and the waters will not invade the shore – when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men.

### Responsorial Psalm Ps 8:4-9. R. v.2

**(R.) O Lord, our God,  
how wonderful your name in all the earth!**

1. When I see the heavens, the work of your hands, the moon and the stars which you arranged, what is man that you should keep him in mind, mortal man that you care for him? **(R.)**
2. Yet you have made him little less than a god; with glory and honour you crowned him, gave him power over the works of your hand, put all things under his feet. **(R.)**
3. All of them, sheep and cattle, yes, even the savage beasts, birds of the air, and fish that make their way through the waters. **(R.)**

### Second Reading Rom 5:1-5

#### A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

*To God through Christ in the love which is poured out through the Spirit.*

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God's glory. But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us.

### Gospel Jn 16:12-15

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

*Whatever the Father has is mine. The Spirit will receive what I give and tell you about it.*

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now.

But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'
