REFLECTION

The setting for the Annunciation to Mary appears to be a domestic setting. The angel came to her, in her home, in the midst of her ordinary daily life. This is so different to the setting for the angel's appearance to Zechariah, in the parallel annunciation scene in the first chapter of Luke. Zechariah is in the Holy of Holies. So it seems to have been in an ordinary domestic setting that this marvelous intervention of God into Mary's life occurred. We can say in effect that in the first annunciation story, Zechariah went to God, but in the second story God comes to Mary.

We can also note the contrast between Jerusalem, with its magnificent temple where the Lord appeared to Zechariah, and Nazareth where the angel appeared to Mary. "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?", people asked. It was a backwater, that held no claims to fame or prestige or religious significance.

At times, we may have a profound experience of God in a chapel or church, but God can and will visit us also in the ordinary setting of our life, in our homes, our work places, while travelling, and so on. Wherever and however God may speak to us, let us pray that we, like Mary, may be able to give our 'fiat', our yes. May we be able to say with Mary: "I am the servant of the Lord; let what you have said be done to me".

For those however who prefer to make a physical donation, envelopes are available in the foyer for you to take home and bring back next weekend. **As always, your kindness and generosity is greatly appreciated.**

Dear parishioners,

I am pleased that with all our prayers, patience and cooperation, NSW had recorded zero cases of community transmission of Coronavirus. As such, further easing of restrictions was announced by the NSW government. From Monday, 7 December, our church can be allowed 460 attendees with 2-square-meter rule.

But we still have to take all reasonable precautions to protect the health of everyone involved and to observe the directives we have received. Indicators are in each pew for the limit of number of people to sit unless from same household. Dot markers are placed where people should sit. **No more booking required on all masses EXCEPT ON THE 6:00pm CHRISTMAS EVE AND 9:00am AND 10:30am CHRISTMAS DAY MASSES.**

It is still a requirement that attendees should write their name, telephone or email address in the sheet provided upon church entry at main door on weekends, Advent Evening Masses, Vigil and Christmas Day; side doors on weekdays.

As you would all be aware, the government has strongly recommended the wearing of face masks in closed-in places, including places of worship. Whilst this is not compulsory, we would urge you to consider complying for your benefit and that of everyone else too. Congregation singing will be permitted provided that mask is worn. We are trying as much as possible to keep our church a safe place in which all are welcome to come and worship the Lord. I, for one choose to wear a mask, particularly when distributing communion and when meeting and talking to people. I know you will understand that I do so for our common protection.

1. Our Lady of Fatima Kingsgrove church is open for **personal prayer from 8:30am to 12:00 noon Tuesday to Saturday.** Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required. Entry by side door.

2. **Daily Mass:**
Tuesday- Thursday and Saturday 9:15am
Friday 11:00am-12:00pm Exposition of the Holy Eucharist followed by Mass at 12:00pm.
Maximum of 460 people. Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required.

3. **Saturday 9:15 am** morning Mass is followed by **Confession until 10.30am.** No booking required.

4. **Weekend Mass, regular schedule resumed, maximum of 460 people. All weekend mass - no Booking required**

Saturday Vigil - 5:00pm

Sunday - 8:30am
10:00am
5:00pm

Please come early when attending mass for registration and to secure your seats. We are now allowed 460 people inside the church on a first come, first serve basis.

5. **Dispensation is now lifted. Under Canon 1247, attendance at mass on Sundays, Holy days and Christmas is now obligatory once again. All Catholics except those at-risk (the_elderly, the sick and those with compromised immune and respiratory systems) are exhorted to take reasonable steps to attend mass. Please take copy of Pastoral letter from Archbishop Anthony Fisher from the church foyer.**

6. **Anointing of the sick** will continue to be administered as a Viaticum for the gravely ill and the dying.

7. For **funerals** maximum capacity caps was removed from 7 December subject to 2-square-metre rule.

8. **Baptisms** can be celebrated with maximum attendees subject to 2-square-metre rule.

9. **Weddings** - maximum capacity caps was removed from 7 Dec subject to 2-square-metre rule.

If you or someone you love is ill and you wish to offer a prayer for them, I am available to pray for you over the telephone. Please call to organise.

Please remember that you may offer Mass for anniversaries, special intentions, thanksgiving or any reason simply by placing your request in an envelope and bringing that to the office or in the mass offering box at the presbytery.

Volunteers do not need to pay for the WWC.
