Dear Parishioners,

Once again, the generosity of Kingsgrove Parishioners and their networks are staggering. I wanted to express my sincerest thanks to those of you who were so generous in giving to our collection of goods for the victims of our devastating bush fires throughout NSW and Victoria. Also to the band of people who helped sort, wash and pack items- a huge thank you!

The amount of items collected was extraordinary. Please accept my sincere apology to those of you who were turned away with your offerings. I am very grateful for your understanding that there was simply not enough room to take every item, as many were in excess for the need of a particular area. Your donations of clothes, household items, nappies, pet food, sanitary items, linen and water- to name a portion of what was offered- has started to be distributed.

There have been 2 van loads taken to date, with more to go this week and next. Items have been distributed to local RFS volunteers and communities in Adelong and Cobargo through Lighthouse Community Support and through our connections with Zonta Clubs in Sydney West, Blue Mountains, Northern Beaches and the Central Coast, donations will also go to people in need in community housing, women's shelters and anyone asking for assistance in areas between west and north of Taree, Port Macquarie, and the Blue Mountains and surrounds. Also, just to allay any thought that these items were not needed- and only monetary donations were required-this is actually not correct. Some of these items are essential to be given to families where various circumstances or addictions make cash handouts unfeasible. This is very sad, but true. So your donations have, and will help, the neediest of the needy. Gratitude is not enough, but I thank you most sincerely from our partner agencies and especially from me, for making this possible. "Together we are better".

Gospel Lk 12: 22-32

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

It has pleased your heavenly Father to give you the kingdom.

Jesus said to his disciples, 'That is why I am telling you not to worry about your life and what you are to eat, nor about your body and how you are to clothe it. For life means more than food, and the body more than clothing. Think of the ravens. They do not sow or reap; they have no storehouses and no barns; yet God feeds them. And how much more are you worth than the birds! Can any of you, for all his worrying, add a single cubit to his span of life?

If the smallest things, therefore, are outside your control, why worry about the rest? Think of the flowers; they never have to spin our weave; yet, I assure you, not even Solomon in all his regalia was robed like one of these. Now if that is how God clothes the grass in the field which is there today and thrown into the furnace tomorrow, how much more will he look after you, you men of little faith! But you, you must not set your hearts on things to eat and things to drink; nor must you worry. It is the pagans of this world who set their hearts on these things. Your Father well knows you need them. No; set your hearts on his kingdom, and these other things will be given you as well.
