DEMPSEY AWARD -MARGARET MCCAFFERTY

Margaret deeply involved herself in the Church community. She worked voluntarily for Monsignor Cronin to keep accurate accounting records for the Parish.

Margaret is a very active and involved member of the Catholic Women's League-concerned with the social and moral issues affecting family life in today's society. The Kingsgrove CWL receives reports on current issues-trafficking of women and children, refugees, poverty in Australia, youth unemployment, violence and asylum seekers. Members of the Kingsgrove branch actively work to support groups working on Justice issues. Margaret supports fundraising initiatives for the project of the year-these included support for St Vincent de Paul Society (local Group), children's mission, St Anthony's Family Care, Canna Community, and the Ursuline projects of building wells in Sudan to increase women's safety and roads in Cambodia to allow children's access to school during the wet season.

In 1995 Margaret volunteered to work for the Josephite Sisters in North Sydney. She conducts tours of the McKillop Museum each Monday. She relates well with adults, seniors, students and members of Religious Orders who visit the Museum. She is generous with her time and if a guide is ill or absent she is ready to give added help. Margaret is a quiet self-effacing worker. She draws no attention to herself. The Dempsey Medal would be a fitting acknowledgement of her unique contribution to the Parish and Church community.

REFLECTION

Part of Jesus' Last Farewell is the assurance that he will not leave the disciples 'orphans'. Hence, he tells them not be troubled or afraid. The *parakletos* is coming, sent by the Father in his name. The New American Bible, the New Revised Standard Version, and the Jerusalem Bible consistently use 'Advocate' to translate this Greek word. Other translations render it as 'Paraclete.'

In earlier Greek, parakletos signified one called in to be a person's defense, a helper in court, one who pleads the cause of another. During the time of Jesus, the Jews-largely ignorant of the Roman law and language-usually employed Roman 'advocates' in their trials before the Roman courts. By referring to the Holy Spirit as 'Advocate', Jesus describes what is the work and the office of the Holy Spirit. Aside from being the Spirit of gifts and empowerment sent from the Father to continue the mission of Jesus, this Spirit is Counsellor, Helper, Comforter, and Intercessor. He will teach us (cf Jn 14:26) to testify about Jesus (cf Jn 15:26). On the other hand, by the Johannine reference to Jesus as 'Advocate', we are made to realise that though physically unseen by us, Jesus will continue to mediate for us in the glory of the Father. Hence, the believers draw comfort from the fact that Jesus is now with the Father. They will have the gift of peace because they have divine comforters, guides, and intercessors from their two 'Advocates'. Wounded, battered and tempted, we may find life to be a 'trial'. But with the divine 'Comforters'-the Lord Jesus and the Holy Spirit-by our side, we shall not be afraid. For if God is with us, who can be against us? God's Word 2019 Daily Reflections

Sunday, 26 May 2019: Sixth Sunday of Easter - Year C

First Reading Acts 15:1-2. 22-29
A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and ourselves not to burden you beyond what is essential.

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and <u>Barnabas</u> had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and <u>Barnabas</u> and others of the church should go up to <u>Jerusalem</u> and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to <u>Antioch</u> with Paul and <u>Barnabas</u>; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as <u>Barsabbas</u> and <u>Silas</u>, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to yo with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

Second Reading Rv 21:10-14, 22-23 A reading from the book of the Apocalypse

He showed me the holy city coming down out of heaven. In the spirit, the angel took me to the top of an enormous high mountain and showed me <u>Jerusalem</u>, the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven. It had all the radiant glory of God and glittered like some precious jewel of crystal-clear diamond. The walls of it were of a great height, and had twelve gates; at each of the twelve gates there was an angel, and over the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of <u>Israel</u>; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of the one of

the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it.

Gospel Jn 14:23-29

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

The Holy Spirit will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him. Those who do not love me do not keep my words. And my word is not my own: it is the word of the one who sent me. I have said these things to you while still with you; but the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you. Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me say: I am going away, and shall return. If you loved me you would have been glad to know that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you this now before it happens, so that when it does happen you may believe.
