REFLECTION

Today, we reflect on the life of the Holy Family in Nazareth. At one level we know very little about this period of Jesus ' life. In today 's Gospel St Luke simply tell us that in Nazareth 'the child grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom, and God 's favour was with him.'

Luke also tells us that his parents did 'everything the Law of the Law required '. From that, we can conclude that Jesus grew up in a religious home in Nazareth, characterised by prayer and faithfulness to God 's law. Throughout his public ministry Jesus revealed a familiarity with the Hebrew Scriptures-the Torah, the prophets and psalms-and we can assume that he came to know these texts during his formative years in Nazareth. We also know that he worked as a carpenter, like Joseph.

No doubt, the holy Family experienced difficult times in Nazareth, as well as blessed moments. We have the record of an incident when Jesus was twelve-years-old, and his parents lost him. How traumatic that must have been for Mary and Joseph. At a certain stage Jesus and Mary would have grieved the death of Joseph. Simeon 's prophecy to Mary that a sword would pierce her own soul points to Jesus passion and death, and much more besides including incidents, unknown to us, during Jesus ' childhood.

Outwardly, modern-day family life appears so different to family life in Jesus ' day. But in the essentials of faith in God, love for each other, and courage in difficult times, the life of the Holy Family continues to offer us encouragement and inspiration.

Dear parishioners,

It is so frustrating that we have again some cases of community transmission of Coronavirus in some parts of NSW. As such, the easing of restrictions from 7 December was reversed and we are back again to 4-square metre rule.

We have to be careful and take all reasonable precautions to protect the health of everyone involved and to observe the directives we have received. We are again back to 4 square metre rule with 230 people in the church. Indicators are in each pew for the limit of number of people to sit unless from same household. Dot markers are placed where people should sit. No booking required on all masses but on a first come, first serve basis.

It is always a requirement that attendees should write their name, telephone or email address in the sheet provided upon church entry at main door on weekends, side doors on Weekdays, or register by scanning the QR code on your mobile phones.

As you would all be aware, the government has strongly recommended the <u>wearing of face masks</u> in closed-in places, including places of worship. Whilst this is not compulsory, we would urge you to consider complying for your benefit and that of everyone else too. Congregation singing is now cancelled until further notice. We are trying as much as possible to keep our church a safe place in which all are welcome to come and worship the Lord. I, for one choose to wear a mask, particularly when distributing communion and when meeting and talking to people. I know you will understand that I do so for our common protection.

- Our Lady of Fatima Kingsgrove church is open for personal prayer from 8:30am to 12:00 noon Tuesday to Saturday. Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required. Entry by side door.
- Daily Mass: Tuesday- Thursday and Saturday 9:15am Friday 11:00am-12:00pm Exposition of the Holy Eucharist followed by Mass at 12:00pm. Maximum of 230 people. Physical distancing and hygiene directions apply. No booking required.
- Saturday 9:15 am morning Mass is followed by Confession until 10.30am. No booking required.
- 4. Weekend Mass, regular schedule resumed, maximum of 460 people. All weekend mass - no Booking required Saturday Vigil - 5:00pm Sunday - 8:30am 10:00am 5:00pm

Please come early when attending mass for registration and to secure your seats. Untill further notice, we are allowed 230 people inside the church on a first come, first serve basis.

- In last week's bulletin, we had stated that Dispensation had been lifted but with the current situation of more cases of Coronavirus going around, dispensation is again back until further notice. All Catholics but priests will be dispensed from Sunday and Holy day obligations.
- 6. **Anointing of the sick** will continue to be administered as a Viaticum for the gravely ill and the dying.

- 7. For **funerals** up to 300 people with 4-square metre rule.
- 8. **Baptisms** can be celebrated with 230 attendees subject to 4-square-metre rule.
- 9. Weddings can be celebrated with 230 guests inside our church. Other venues, 300 people.

All of these notices might change depending on the Covid 19 situation.

If you or someone you love is ill and you wish to offer a prayer for them, I am available to pray for you over the telephone. Please call to organise.

Please remember that you may offer Mass for anniversaries, special intentions, thanksgiving or any reason simply by placing your request in an envelope and bringing that to the office or in the mass offering box at the presbytery.


