

REFLECTION

Amos was a prophet of the eighth century before Jesus, living a century before the Exile when the Temple was destroyed. Amos warns people who live a decadent lifestyle which exploits poor people that punishments written into the Jewish law are coming for them because their way of living breaks God's law.

Jesus also speaks about decadent living in which fellow human beings can be left to live like dogs. To a group of people whom Luke had just described as 'lovers of money' (Luke 16:14), Jesus tells a parable about a rich man and a poor man who are impossibly far apart economically and socially. In the parable, there is an impassable gulf between both men, both in life on earth and in their life after death. The rich man expects to be favoured after death as he was in life but the same kind of gulf that he allowed between himself and the poor man now exists between them in death. We must do the good we can, while we can; we cannot allow luxury to delude us into allowing others to live inhuman lives.

In the Psalm we praise God who is just, feeds the hungry and sets prisoners free.






A message from the Archdiocese of Sydney

A reading from the prophet Amos

You who give yourself to licentiousness and revelry will be exiled.

The almighty Lord says this: Woe to those ensconced so snugly in Zion and to those who feel so safe on the mountain of Samaria.

Lying on ivory beds and sprawling on their divans, they dine on lambs from the flock, and stall-fattened veal; they bawl to the sound of the harp, they invent new instruments of music like David, they drink wine by the bowlful, and use the finest oil for anointing themselves, but about the ruin of Joseph they do not care at all. That is why they will be the first to be exiled; the sprawlers' revelry is

During your life good things came your way just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted while you are in agony.

Jesus said to the Pharisees: 'There was a rich man who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast

magnificently every day. And at his gate there lay a poor man called Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to fill himself with the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even came and licked his sores. Now the poor man died and was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried.

'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things come your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours." 'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning, so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham "let them listen to them." "Ah no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."
