#### REFLECTION

Passing through Galilee, en route to Jerusalem with the Twelve, Jesus told them that ignominious death at the hands of his enemies awaited him, after which he would rise again. Not surprisingly, this provoked an animated discussion among these often uncomprehending disciples who seemed to be more concerned about their future prospects and their personal status within the group than about Jesus' imminent demise. When they reached Capernaum, where Peter's mother-in-law lived, Jesus put them on the spot by asking what they had been arguing about. With good reason they were embarrassed and chose not to respond. At this point in their commitment to Jesus, lacking the simplicity and candour of a child, they had yet to understand, much less accept, the true nature of Jesus' mission as God's 'Suffering Servant'. Unmindful of his predilection for the poor and the outcast, they also failed to comprehend that the glory of God could shine forth most brilliantly in the face of the crucified Christ. In our day Pope Francis has frequently drawn attention to Jesus; words. "If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all"- words we must take to heart, clergy and laity alike.

# PARISH RESPONSE TO COVID-19 VIRUS LOCKDOWN: Dear Parishioners,

It is sad to hear that lockdown in Greater Sydney had been extended that all places of worship are to remain closed from 6:00pm, Saturday, 26 June to end of September or until further notice.

This is an understandably difficult and painful decision for all Catholics and all people of faith. We adhere to this decision in order to assist in stopping the spread of the Delta strain coronavirus.

Accordingly, we are implementing the following measures:

- 1. The church is closed. There will be no public Masses nor liturgies, outdoor until further notice. There will be one live streamed mass every Sunday, 10:00am.
- 2. Catholics are dispensed from Sunday obligations during the lockdown period.
- 3. Funerals will still be conducted but with a limit of 10 people and need to comply with social distancing of 4-square-metre rule and mandatory wearing of face masks for all attendees.
- 4. Weddings are permitted but only 5 guests.
- Baptisms are not permitted, except in case of emergency.
- Anointing of the sick, and sick calls generally, are permitted in case of emergency.

#### Pastoral support

Whilst we are dispensed from our Sunday obligations there are ways we can still honour Sundays in these difficult times. Masses will be available for viewing live streamed in various churches within the Archdiocese or join ours at 10:00am this Sunday, details on front page. - •If you or someone you love is ill and you wish to offer a prayer for them, Father Casey and or Father Stephen are available to pray for you over the telephone. Please call to organise.
- •At present, the situation is fluid and we are considering what can and cannot be done to support our community. We will keep everyone informed as decisions are made relating to ways to help you pastorally, particularly the vulnerable and those who are in need.
- •It seems that because the new Delta strain of virus is so infectious, we are being asked to be even more cautious than during the previous year's lockdown. Hence, Parish office is closed until further notice.
- •Parish bulletins will be available online or hard copies may be collected from outside the church on Fridays after 1pm.
- •At this time of the Covid-19 pandemic when so many people have already been affected financially, we understand how difficult things are, however we ask that you please continue to support the parish if you can, as we still need to maintain the church. Donations can be made via credit card, or direct deposit through our website. Alternatively, Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) with our bank details on page 4. We thank those who had made their donations via EFT and Credit Cards. The new sets of envelopes for the financial year 2021/2022 will be available for collection in front of the church for another 2 weeks, Friday, 17 & 24 September and Saturday, 18 & 25 September, 10am to 4:00pm. You can place your donations with your envelopes in the presbytery Mass Offering Box. The tax receipts were mailed last 12 August. Thank you for

your generous contributions.

- •Father Casey and Father Stephen will continue to celebrate daily and weekend Mass privately and offer Masses for the sick of the parish and for the whole community and the world. If you wish to offer a Mass for a loved one, you may bring the Mass request envelope and place it in the presbytery Mass Offering Box and either Father Casey or Father Stephen will offer the Mass privately.
- •We encourage you to continue praying, to read and ponder on the Sacred Scriptures, to pray the Rosary and your favourite devotions individually and, ideally, as a family too.
- •Let us connect with one another spiritually by pausing for a minute of silence and praying one Hail Mary at 12:00 noon every day.

These are challenging times, please do not be disheartened. Let us shake Heaven with our prayers and care and support one another in faith. Our Lady of Fatima, our celestial Mother, walks with us so let us turn to her in prayer. We are all one on this journey. May God bless us all.

# A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of humanity ... All who wish to be first must make themselves the servants of all.

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples made their way through Galilee; and he did not want anyone to know, because he was instructing his disciples; he was telling them, 'The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death; and three days after he has been put to death he will rise again.' But they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him.

They came to Capernaum, and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road?' They said nothing because they had been arguing which of them was the greatest. So he sat down, called the Twelve to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.'
