

REFLECTION

Scripture scholars (perhaps with John 6:60 in mind) sometimes refer to the 'hard sayings' of Jesus-aspects of his teaching which may; at first glance, seem unduly demanding, even unreasonable, to his would-be disciples. In interpreting these 'hard sayings', we must make allowance for the fact that Jesus is sometimes speaking metaphorically and using Semitic hyperbole. If we take literally (as doubtless people have done) Jesus' words, "if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out", we may find ourselves like Dicken's irascible schoolmaster, Wackford Squeers, who 'had but one eye, and the popular prejudice runs in favour of two'. As we reflect on Jesus' 'hard sayings' in today's Gospel reading, we may feel rather discouraged. Even despite our best efforts, our life of faith falls far short of the ideal that he proposes. At such times, we need to turn to the God who is rich in mercy and pray like the father of the boy from whom Jesus expelled an unclean spirit-"I do have faith. Help the little faith I have!" (Mark 9:24). Take heart and say with Paul: "There is nothing I cannot master with the help of the One who gives me strength." (Philippians 4:3).

PARISH RESPONSE TO COVID-19 VIRUS LOCKDOWN: Dear Parishioners,

We thank God that there are some easing of restrictions in Greater Sydney but all places of worship are still to remain closed till end of September or until further notice.

This is an understandably difficult and painful decision for all Catholics and all people of faith. We adhere to this decision in order to assist in stopping the spread of the Delta strain coronavirus.

Accordingly, we are implementing the following measures:

- The church is closed. There will be no public Masses nor liturgies, outdoor until further notice. There will be one live streamed mass every Sunday, 10:00am.
- Catholics are dispensed from Sunday obligations during the lockdown period.
- 3. Funerals will still be conducted but with a limit of 10 people and need to comply with social distancing of 4-square-metre rule and mandatory wearing of face masks for all attendees.
- 4. Weddings are permitted but only 5 guests.
- 5. Baptisms are not permitted, except in case of emergency.
- Anointing of the sick, and sick calls generally, are permitted in case of emergency.

Pastoral support

Whilst we are dispensed from our Sunday obligations there are ways we can still honour Sundays in these difficult times. Masses will be available for viewing live streamed in various churches within the Archdiocese or join ours at 10:00am this Sunday, details on front page. - •If you or someone you love is ill and you wish to offer a prayer for them, Father Casey and or Father Stephen are available to pray for you over the telephone. Please call to organise.
- •At present, the situation is fluid and we are considering what can and cannot be done to support our community. We will keep everyone informed as decisions are made relating to ways to help you pastorally, particularly the vulnerable and those who are in need.
- •It seems that because the new Delta strain of virus is so infectious, we are being asked to be even more cautious than during the previous year's lockdown. Hence, Parish office is closed until further notice.
- •Parish bulletins will be available online or hard copies may be collected from outside the church on Fridays after 1pm.
- •At this time of the Covid-19 pandemic when so many people have already been affected financially. we understand how difficult things are, however we ask that you please continue to support the parish if you can, as we still need to maintain the church. Donations can be made via credit card, or direct deposit through our website. Alternatively, Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) with our bank details on page 4. We thank those who had made their donations via EFT and Credit Cards. The new sets of envelopes for the financial year 2021/2022 will be available for collection in front of the church for another week, Friday, 24 September and Saturday, 25 September, 10am to 4:00pm. You can place your donations with your envelopes in the presbytery Mass Offering Box. The tax receipts were mailed last 12 August. Thank you for your generous contributions.

- •Father Casey and Father Stephen will continue to celebrate daily and weekend Mass privately and offer Masses for the sick of the parish and for the whole community and the world. If you wish to offer a Mass for a loved one, you may bring the Mass request envelope and place it in the presbytery Mass Offering Box and either Father Casey or Father Stephen will offer the Mass privately.
- •We encourage you to continue praying, to read and ponder on the Sacred Scriptures, to pray the Rosary and your favourite devotions individually and, ideally, as a family too.
- •Let us connect with one another spiritually by pausing for a minute of silence and praying one Hail Mary at 12:00 noon every day.

These are challenging times, please do not be disheartened. Let us shake Heaven with our prayers and care and support one another in faith. Our Lady of Fatima, our celestial Mother, walks with us so let us turn to her in prayer. We are all one on this journey. May God bless us all.



First Reading Nm 11:25-29

A reading from the book of Numbers

Are you jealous on my account? Who decrees that all people may prophesy?

The Lord came down in the Cloud. He spoke with Moses, but took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. When the spirit came on them they prophesied, but not again.

Two men had stayed back in the camp; one was called Eldad and the other Medad. The spirit came down on them; though they had not gone to the Tent, their names were enrolled among the rest. These began to prophesy in the camp. The young man ran to tell this to Moses, 'Look', he said, 'Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.' Then said Joshua the son of Nun, who had served Moses from his youth, 'My Lord Moses, stop them!' Moses answered him, 'Are you jealous on my account? If only the whole people of the Lord were prophets, and the Lord gave his Spirit to them all!'

On earth you have had a life of comfort and luxury; in the time of slaughter you went on eating to your heart's content. It was you who condemned the innocent and killed them; they offered you no resistance.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Anyone who is not against us is for us. If your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off.

John said to Jesus, 'Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name;

and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him.'
But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no one who
works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me.
Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.

'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'
