REFLECTION

The feast of the Most Holy Trinity calls our attention to the great mystery of God. One way of entering into this mystery is by contemplating creation, the work of God's hands. We can look up at the moon and the stars or gaze on a panorama of mountains and valleys and be filled with wonder. Or we can look at a single tiny flower or a newborn infant and have the same sense of awe.

Such feelings engulf the author of today's responsorial psalm. What is most marvelous, and indeed most humbling and frightening, for the psalmist is the exalted place God has given to humans in the order of creation. We have been given a share in God's royal authority over creation. Our God is never a hoarder of power but One who freely delegates this power to us.

It is a great honour and an awesome responsibility to have been entrusted by God with care of the earth. 'Sheep and cattle, yes even with wild beasts, birds of the air and fish' have all been entrusted to our stewardship. We can use our royal role to be promoters of life or agents of death. This psalm reminds us that praise of God does not mean leaving everything to God. We cannot spend all our time on our knees exclaiming, 'O Lord, our God, how wonderful you are!' At the end of every Eucharist, we are sent out to love and praise the Lord by caring for our fellow human beings and for all of creation. Refreshed by the liturgy, we are called to roll up our sleeves and take up our task.

A reading from the book of Proverbs

*Wisdom was born before the earth was made.
The Wisdom of God cries aloud:*

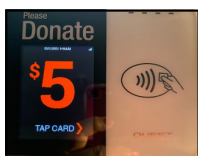

“Safeguarding in our Parish

It is my responsibility and your responsibility!

Most of the members of our Children's Liturgy, Children's choir, Sacramental Programme educators, Youth Ministry,

Acolyte or Minister of Holy Communion, Senior Altar Server, Reader, Warden or counters undertook Safeguarding training in 2019. If you are new to these Ministries and have not attended a parish Safeguarding Induction Training session, please register for an on-line training course at <https://goo.gl/forms/wSkRi3ZO6PzkRfbo1>.

The Safeguarding Office of our Archdiocese has decided that a 3 yearly **Refresher Training** is required for members of these ministries, i.e. those trained in 2019 or earlier.

Unfortunately, due to current COVID-19 concerns the Safeguarding Office has decided to present all training for the first six months of 2022 either online or via zoom.

Volunteers can register for the new Refresher Training **on line** via this link <https://forms.gle/XuQFsRsvq3BYtXqT9> (which is a different link from the other online training registrations). Just a reminder that volunteers only need to complete the Refresher Training if they have completed the Induction Training prior to 2020.
