REFLECTION

The Beatitudes might well be described as the opening of Jesus' inaugural speech as he set about explaining to a large gathering what his mission was going to be. He began with eight statements of hope and encouragement directed to ordinary people struggling with things like injustice, destitution, grief and discrimination. In the kingdom of God which he was ushering in, they would find consolation, blessing, comfort and acceptance. But before proceeding, he hastened to explain himself: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law and the prophets. I have come not to abolish them but to fulfil them" (Matthew 5:17). The Beatitudes, then, complement the Law and the Prophets, describing people who struggle yet remain faithful, who turn their attention to compassion and care for others, who work for justice and peace. How do we bring the Beatitudes to life in our world today?

The PPC is aware that so many people are generously giving their time to volunteer in a range of ministries that are having a positive effect on the lives of many people, both within the parish and outside of it. We would like to acknowledge these wonderful works and call them out across the various platforms that are available to us.

WEDDING ANNIVERSARY COMMITTEE FOR WEDDING ANNIVERSARY MASS CELEBRATION

This special celebration takes place at the 10am Mass in August. We bring couples together to celebrate their special Wedding Anniversaries during the Mass and renew their vows.

We celebrate **10**, **15**, **20**, **25**, **30**, **35**, **40**, **45**, **50**, **55**, **60** or more years. This is a chance to celebrate and acknowledge their great devotion to each other during their married life together.

At the beginning of Mass we place a flower lapel on the husband's coat and corsage on the wife's clothes. We also give them a special candle as a memento of this special celebration.

We advertise the upcoming Wedding Anniversary Celebration Mass for at least a month beforehand. We send a confirmation letter to the couples after they commit to being part of this special celebration. The invitation also extends to family and friends. After the Homily Father Casey brings the couples to the front of the Altar to renew their vows. We organise special Prayers of the Faithful especially dedicated to the Wedding Anniversary Mass.

We also ask the couples to give us a photo of their Wedding Day and one of them as they are now. We use these photos for a PowerPoint Presentation accompanied by singing. This happens after communion.

Just before the final blessing, Father Casey blesses the special Anniversary Cake and then we have a photo cutting the cake with all the couples and Father Casey.

Following the Mass the Wedding Anniversary Committee put on morning tea for all the couples and their families, friends and Parishioners.

The human race has nothing to boast about to God, but you, God has made members of Christ Jesus and by God's doing he has become our wisdom, and our virtue, and our holiness, and our freedom. As scripture says: if anyone wants to boast, let him boast about the Lord.

"Safeguarding in our Parish

Youth

It is my responsibility and your responsibility!

Most of the members of our Children's Liturgy, Children's choir, Sacramental

Programme educators, Youth Ministry, Acolyte or Minister of Holy Communion, Senior Altar Server, Reader, Warden or counters undertook Safeguarding training in 2019. If you are new to these Ministries and have not attended a parish Safeguarding Induction Training session, please register for an on-line training course at https://forms.gle/9ebT3voEAtfP7P8R9 or via Zoom by sending an email to safeguardingtraining@sydneycatholic.org

The Safeguarding Office of our Archdiocese has decided that a 3 yearly **Refresher Training** is required for members of these ministries, i.e. those trained in 2019 or earlier.

Volunteers can register for the new Refresher Training on line via this link https://forms.gle/ XuQFsRsvg3BYtXgT9 or via Zoom by sending an email to safeguardingtraining@sydneycatholic.org Just a reminder that volunteers only need to complete the Refresher Training if they have completed the Induction Training prior to 2020.
