REFLECTION

In the ancient world, it was not uncommon for rulers to describe themselves as gods, claiming to have certain divine powers and qualities. The people of Israel would never allow their rulers to be called gods. There is only one God, the Lord. Their faith is expressed in today's psalm: "The Lord is great and worthy of praise, to be feared above all gods (pagan rulers). The gods of the heathens are naught. It was the Lord who made the heavens."

The people of Israel were, however, tolerant of pagan rulers calling themselves gods. They saw these rulers as having a subordinate role in God's governance of the world. Through them, God's will could be accomplished among the peoples. A good example was Cyrus, the Persian king mentioned in today's first reading, whom the Jews saw as God's chosen instrument to liberate them from their exile in Babylon.

In our own day the leaders of nations have the power to effect good and promote the values of the kingdom of God. Not all leaders do this but there are many who strive to exercise wise and just leadership. There need not be an unbridgeable gulf between civil governance and the governance of God. In fulfilling our obligations toward the State, we can in fact be promoting the values of the kingdom of God. Respecting legitimate temporal authority is one means of paying homage to God, the only One to whom all praise and honour are due. *God's Word 2023*

OUR YOUTH.....

During our September youth group gathering, Father Casey blessed the meal before we commenced. The gathering centered around the theme of

"The Cross" with Tuione and Joe leading the discussion. They explored the various ways Catholics perceive the cross, whether as a religious symbol representing Jesus' sacrifice or simply as a piece of jewellery.

OUR YOUTH....

Throughout the session, we encouraged the youth to look up specific Bible verses, helping them develop their skills in using and reading the Bible for future gatherings. One of the key verses discussed was Romans 5:8, which states, "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this, while we were still sinners Christ died for us." We also delved into the story of the Bronze Snake (Numbers 21:4-9), which serves as a powerful metaphor for God's grace, forgiveness, and the role of faith in bringing healing and salvation.

During the gathering, the youth engaged in open discussions about their perspectives on the cross and their emotional responses when looking at it. Some expressed feelings of gratitude, as the cross symbolised Jesus' sacrifice for sinners like themselves. Others associated it with the Catholic Church and the concept of forgiveness through confession. Following these discussions, which expanded the youth's understanding of the Cross, we concluded the gathering with team-building activities.

The youth were divided into two groups, and we organised four rounds of different activities. These included a crossword puzzle, a word search, trivia questions related to the crucifixion, and a spelling bee. Congratulations to Group 2 who were our all-rounder champions. To end our gathering, Father Casey offered a final blessing to the youth group.

First Reading Isaiah 45:1.4-6

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

I have taken the hand of Cyrus to subdue nations before his countenance.

Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.'
