REFLECTION

Because John, the son of the priest Zechariah, baptizes people in the Jordan River, the moniker "Baptist' is attached to his name. But in the Fourth Gospel, he is primarily a 'witness,' the first and the witness par excellence to Jesus.

What testimony does John give to the delegation consisting of priests and Levites who launch a formal inquiry against him? They ask him who he is and why he baptizes. Rather than identifying himself, he formally states who he is not. "I am not the Christ". Asked if he is Elijah, he responds: "I am not" And asked if he is the prophet like Moses, he answers: "No". When pressed for his identity, he reveals himself as "a voice that cries in the wilderness".

The voice acknowledges only that he baptizes with water. But he goes to say: "There stands among you-unknown to you-the one coming after me, and I am not fit to undo his sandal strap". John's act of humility further enhances the honour of the one to whom he gives witness: Jesus of Nazareth. Here and in the following episodes, John testifies to Jesus as the Master, the Son of God, the Lamb of God, the Bridegroom. John does not only testify with words but also with deed. And he witnesses to the very end, to the shedding of his blood.

On this Gaudette Sunday, when we are invited to rejoice always, we are reminded that the 'works of Christmas' focus on the joyful witnessing to Christ, the Saviour of the world, the Lamb of God, who takes away our sins. Our witnessing may not reach the point of shedding blood in martyrdom, but we are invited to 'die to ourselves' so that the life of Jesus may be made manifest through us in our humility and acts of love and service.

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

I exult for joy in the Lord.

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken;

to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison; to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord.

'I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God, for he has clothed me in the garments of salvation, he has wrapped me in the cloak of integrity, like a bridegroom wearing his wreath, like a bride adorned in her jewels.

'For as the earth makes fresh things grow, as a garden makes seeds spring up, so will the Lord make both integrity and praise spring up in the sight of the nations.'

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

There stands among you, unknown to you, the one who is coming after me.

as a witness to speak for the light,
so that everyone might believe through him.
He was not the light,
only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

Third Candle: Joy - Not purple, but a type of pink because we all know that Jesus ROSE from the dead. All jokes aside, it is a wonderful and happy

The colour rose/pink represents Joy. Another name for this event is 'Gaudete' Sunday which means rejoice. We remember the Shepherds this week, as they rejoiced in the news that Christ is coming to our world. There are so many symbolic and meaningful archetype examples that come from the shepherds in relation to Jesus. The two most commonly known examples are that Jesus is our Shepheard and He is also the Sacrificial lamb that is offered on the Cross for our sins. The status of a Shepheard is extremely important as the gathering

of the sheep is symbolic for our community coming together in joy for the arrival of our Lord. There are no better leaders than the shepherds who give a great deal of care to their lambs. As the shepherds lead the flock to green pastures and clean water, we can almost see the priestly mission from our Mass where the gifts that are offered at each celebration will lead us directly to God.




