### REFLECTION

Today the Church celebrates the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (or Corpus Christi as it was known). This feast day not only provides an opportunity to renew our devotion in the Blessed Sacrament, but also to deepen our understanding of what Eucharist means. The word Eucharist comes from the Greek term meaning, "Thanksgiving". We believe that in the consecrated bread and wine of the Eucharist, Christ is really present. In Mark's gospel today, Jesus takes bread and wine and says that the new "covenant" is His body and blood poured out and shared. The body of Christ is also present in the community gathered in prayer, and in the suffering of people who are being persecuted; in the proclamation of God's Word and in the unexpected and surprising moments of every passing day. On this traditional feast day, how can we broaden our understanding of the meaning of consuming and sharing the Eucharist? How can we be a Eucharistic presence of the people we encounter, and in the busyness and quietness of each day? *God's Word 2024*

# **The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**

## **Year B**

### **First Reading**

Exodus 24:3-8

A reading from the book of Exodus

*This is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you.*

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. 'This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

## Second Reading

Hebrews 9:11-15

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

*The blood of Christ will purify our inner selves.*

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and He has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but His own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement, and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: His death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

# Gospel

Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

*This is my body. This is my blood.*

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the Passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' He said 'this is my body.' Then He took a cup, and when He had returned thanks He gave it to them, and all drank from it, and He said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.'

After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.

# Corpus Christi



Dear brothers and sisters,

On this solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, all believers around the world is celebrating as part of a communion, sharing in the highest mystery of our faith which is the real presence of the saviour Jesus in the consecrated Bread and Wine.

By celebrating this solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we relive the wonderful reality during which the Church does not only celebrate the Eucharist but also solemnly bear it in process, singing hymns of adoration and thanksgiving, publicly proclaiming that the Sacrifice of Christ is for the salvation of the whole world.

The sacrifice of Christ sealed an eternal covenant; a covenant which had been prefigured in the Old Testament as we hear in today's first reading from the Book of Exodus. After the admonition of Moses and having put all the commands of the Lord in writing, the ceremony concludes with the offering of holocausts and the immolation of bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices.

The blood of the sacrifices is cast towards the people as the blood of the Covenant of the Lord with his people.

The fulfilment of the old Covenant comes to its apex in Jesus Christ. We see Jesus, on the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, instructs His disciples on the preparation of the Passover. The story of the preparation is interesting with details and demonstrating the importance of the celebration. The words that Jesus uses as he hands the Bread to his disciples are the very words of consecration that we hear during mass. Jesus is veiled in the consecrated bread, giving himself as a gift. He also perpetuates this ceremony in a command "Do this in memory of me."

Grateful to this immense gift, Christ's followers gather around the Blessed Sacrament since, after the resurrection. In this sense as believers, we are a Church of the resurrection and at the same time of the Eucharist. The church draws her life from the Eucharist. At the same time we know that this truth does not only simply express a daily experience of faith, but also recapitulates the heart of the mystery in which it consists.

Through the Eucharist, the Church is built up as a New Jerusalem, with Jesus as the principle of unity among different persons and peoples around the globe. Therefore, how should we receive such a great gift in our own lives when we come to celebrate the Eucharist?

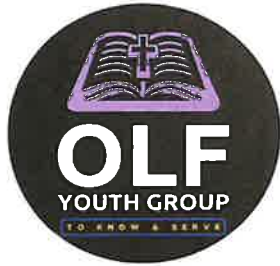
The answer is a short one: with reverence and faith in the real presence of Him who nourishes our spiritual life and advances our communion with each other as disciples.

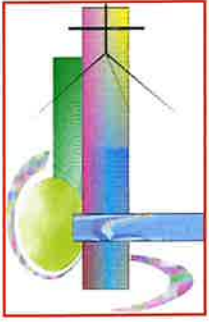
