The Ascension of the Lord

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

And so, the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.



The Quan family have been donating their work to our Parish for many years. Our Parish have been distributing their work at many occasion including feast days, the children's liturgies and to our reflection days.



Below is a brief story on their impact of their mission for the world to pray.

..Where we grew up in the Solomon Islands, there were no rosary beads for sale. This had prompted us make the rosary beads....

In 1995, we started making the rosary beads and sent them to the Missionary Sisters and the Archbishops of Solomon Islands. The rosary beads were distributed to various missions around the islands for free. Slowly, the mission extended to Papua New Guinea, Tonga, Fiji, Samoa, New Caledonia included the missionary and Carmelite Sisters ... To date, our rosary beads has reached 46+ countries; 100 Catholic Primary schools around Australia and it is estimated around 240,000 pairs of Rosary Beads had been made.

What did Mary do?

A very brief Mariology account of Our Lady's impact on the world today.

Happy Mother's Day to all who are gathered to our Parish. We are blessed to be under the patronage of the greatest mother of all time. We hope that this day celebrates all women and their impact to our world, but our Faith can also allow us to utilise this day to honour Our Lady the Mother of God. We can all look at her ministry which has impacted the entire Catholic Church. Women, men, children, parents, married couples, single people and grandparents all have a vocation that would relate to Our Lady. Mary is commonly spoken about on Mother's Day, as the honourable mother, who gave birth to God, our Lord Jesus Christ, who fed the family and maintained the household. We should also look into her Spiritual life, her educated up bringing and the ministry of the Church which started before she was

Early life of Our Lady.

born.

Our Lady's parents, St. Anne and St. Joachim, were considered as older parents when they conceived Mary. Our Lady was given the title of the 'Immaculate Conception' (1854 - Pope Pius IX) as she was spared of Original Sin and her soul would be completely unblemished; in perfect tact for the ministry that would be put before her. As the accounts state, Mary was presented to the Temple when she was three years old (the Presentation of Our Lady - Protoevangelium of James.). Her ministry in the Temple was to learn and stay educated about the Jewish Faith. She would have read the text about the Prophesy of Our Lord's coming to claim His Kingdome (what we call Christmas). Our Lady was perpetually Virgin, even to the time of her betrothal and marriage to St. Joseph.

As a dedicated woman of the service to the Temple, her duties for prayer and community events were daily accounts both at home and in public. Her impact is relatable to our families and the wider community as we see so many women today building and strengthening the church just as she did.

Ministry to Our Lord.

Mary's Motherhood is foretold by the Arch Angel Gabriel (*The Annunciation- Luke 1:26–38*). Our Lady did not object with the Arch Angel or God – she instead enliven the word 'Fiat' which is a complete trust in God. Her status in the Temple meant that the birth of Our Lord would only have to be through the intersession of the Holy Spirit (*Theotokos: Council of Ephesus*). As she was knowledgeable of this prophecy the Canticle of Our Lady can only explain the joy and sheer appreciation that Our Lady had to be worthy to give birth to God. God dwelt among us and put forward His Mother for many of Her event from the account of Finding Jesus in the Temple to the Wedding of Cannan. Mary was always there. His ministry on Earth would never leave us, as on the foot of the cross, Jesus told Our Lady that she would inherit us all as her children (as spoken through St. John the Beloved who was with her). This ministry to God, impacts us all as we see behind every great and Holy moment meant that a prayerful, hopeful, knowledgeable, faithful and loving mother was always there. Today, anyone with the ministry of motherhood or religious instruction can use Mary as the best example of a ministry to God.

The Continuation of Her Ministry

Mary died in a natural and human way but was Assumed body and soul into Heaven (*The Assumption Pope Pius XII*). She appeared across the globe to continue the ministry of Our Lord and help us attain the hope of living and dying in God's grace. Her love is projected each time we call for her intersessions as she takes our petitions and gives them directly to God. We never pray to Mary. We only ask her to *Pray for Us.* In the account of Our Lady appearing to the children of Fatima, Mary explained to us that the world has moved away from the Church and our actions of sin is offending Our Lord. The impact of her apparition was to help us come back to Him and restore our love and devotion to God. Her message was for us to pray the rosary every day, to come back to church and to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation often so we can receive the Eucharist in the purist state of Grace.

As a mum would say "This does not ask too much of us. Mary's loving ways will only benefit us in the long run." By Bernadette Bassil

The Safeguarding Office of our Archdiocese has decided that a 3 yearly Refresher Training is required for members of these ministries, i.e. those trained in 2021 or earlier. Volunteers Training on line via this link can register for the new Refresher https://forms.gle/XuQFsRsvq3BYtXqT9 or via Zoom by sending an email to safeguardingtraining@sydneycatholic.org Just a reminder that volunteers only need to complete the Refresher Training if they have completed the Induction Training prior to 2020.
